In celebration of Women's History Month, Governor Phil Murphy and First Lady Tammy Murphy hosted an event honoring three New Jersey women leaders which was emceed by Secretary of State Tahesha Way. One of the honorees, Caridad Gaetan, is a Little Sister (mentee) in the Big Brothers Big Sisters of Essex, Hudson & Union Counties mentoring program.

Caridad has been a Little Sister for over six years and was a nominee for Little Sister of the Year in 2022. Now a sophomore at Liberty High School in Jersey City, she has shown her dedication to her community through her role as Vice President of the school's Freshman Student Government Association and as a youth leader at her church.

"Caridad Gaetan has demonstrated a sincere dedication to serving others and exceptional leadership capabilities beyond her years," said Governor Murphy. "It is an honor to formally recognize Caridad's accomplishments and I look forward to seeing what comes next in her bright future. We hope that her story can serve as an example to the girls and young women of New Jersey that their futures here are limitless."

With an aptitude for STEAM (science, technology, engineering, art, and mathematics), her elementary school robotics team landed in the top 10 of her school district. She attended STEAM programming at the New Jersey Institute of Technology and was the only "Little" of her class to complete the Computer TIA program during the COVID-19 pandemic.

"It is so wonderful to see young women in our program shine and be recognized for their accomplishments.
